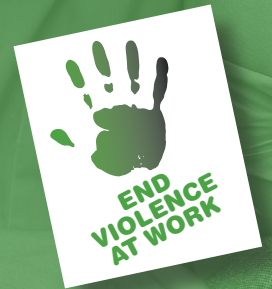




Violence at

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UNISON research has found a 30% rise in violence towards staff working in councils and schools since 2015 – with thousands of violence incidents against staff each year. Violent incidents can include staff being punched, pushed and kicked – along with verbal abuse and threats.
